MESSAGE FROM THE PLT

The school year 2021-2022 continued to be shadowed by the global pandemic. In a year that started with campus closure, the MYIS community learned about connecting and developing as a team, virtually. This was definitely a challenge but one that was faced with the same determination, positivity and grit that we have come to see over the last two years. As a team, we realised that the year followed three clear themes, that of **Resilience, Regrowth and Reconnection.**

Resilience

From August until November, classes formed their new communities via Zoom as students were exposed to a variety of learning engagements that saw them continue to authentically develop their PYP Approaches to Learning Skills, in particular communication and selfmanagement.

In October it was apparent that the Thai Government were beginning to see how school campuses could reopen while keeping students health and safety at the forefront. After a successful campus inspection by the Ministry of Health, MYIS reopened its campus to students in November, after over six months of Distance Learning. The protocols in place for reopening were significant, including, strict social distancing, mask-wearing, closed campus to parents, and bubble groups, to name just a few. Students, however, seemed oblivious to these obstacles, instead, showing their joy and excitement to be back together.

Being on campus for the first time in so many months was a challenge for many and the community showed its caring and resilient nature as people came together to support each other and make the transition back to campus as smooth and calm as possible.

Regrowth

Returning to face-to-face learning on campus was the start of a major period of regrowth for MYIS. It is impossible to talk about the pandemic and not acknowledge the impact it had on the MYIS community. Distance Learning posed many challenges for our students. especially for our youngest learners. At an age where physical interaction and socialisation are the keys to learning, our Early Years found virtual learning particularly difficult with many families choosing to defer. When school returned in January 2022 so too did a large number of our families and the energy and vibrance that a campus of students brings was invigorating for evervone.

The campus showed significant development this year with the construction project quickly progressing from a laid foundation to a building where you were able to see the vision of this exciting facility. Students continued to watch the building take place through the viewing window from the field and conversations have started about the increased possibilities that are to come.

Another exciting development and area of growth for the school have been the preparation and planning for MYIS Grade 6 to open in August 2023. Considering resources, curriculum, facilities, the recruitment of teachers and logistics such as schedules have dominated the planning process and it has been an exciting journey. The partnership with the grade five parents has been a valuable part of the year, allowing us to gain multiple perspectives. Everyone is excited to start the new academic year with a Grade 6 class and to begin our IB MYP candidacy.






Reconnection

As the community returned to campus and restrictions gradually relaxed, students, teachers and parents were able to reconnect and reestablish relationships. For the students, this looked different depending on their age, personality and other characteristics. For our younger learners, many of them were experiencing being away from home for the first time and learning how to socialise and make friends. For our older students, adjusting back to learning without technology, or having a schedule that was less flexible was challenging. With support from their teachers and families, all of our students reconnected with face-to-face learning and benefitted from the opportunity to reflect on what they had experienced, while living through a global pandemic. The Parent Working Group were committed to reconnecting parents and faced the challenges that the restrictions posed. The Fundraising Committee ran a number of fundraising stalls in the second term.





Parents came together to create a drinks/ dessert stall at dismissal, resulting in an atmosphere of excitement. While unable to come on campus for the majority of the year, parents collaborated with teachers to support during Book Week as well as coming onto campus for Student-Led Conferences and end of the year Celebrations of Learning. These opportunities were eagerly anticipated by the whole community, who definitely realised the importance of the connection between home and school!

Professional Development was another example of how people in the community were able to reconnect with one another, both during the period of isolation and once we were back on campus. Through the PYP South East Asia Network, MYIS teachers were able to meet and learn with their fellow educators over Zoom, with many of these sessions being led by our own teachers. In March MYIS hosted over 70 different teachers on campus to participate in three official PYP workshops. The atmosphere over the two days was electric as teachers excitedly reconnected

with their peers and learn together. We look forward to more of these opportunities in the future, particularly with our MYP colleagues. We were able to run five different parent sessions on topics such as Positive Discipline, assessment and fractions. These events, whether held on Zoom or in person, allowed parents to deepen their shared understanding of the way their children learn and what they can do to help them from home. We look forward to more of these sessions in the new year.

Whether it was showing resilience at the hardest and most challenging times, or excitedly reconnecting once back on campus, the MYIS community proved again, what a strong group we are. The period of growth is just beginning and we are excited to see the incredible opportunities the future brings, not just for MYIS but for the parents, teachers and especially for the students! We would like to thank everyone in the MYIS community for helping to make this year such a positive experience. We look forward to an exciting year ahead in 2022/2023!



MYIS FUTURE

Construction Progress for the New Multipurpose Building (June 2022)

The school year 2021-2022 witnessed rapid progress for the new multipurpose building which is scheduled to open in January 2023. During the beginning of the academic year, a large billboard with a 3D representation of the multipurpose building was installed at the soccer field and a viewing window was created to allow students to see the progress at the site when they arrived on campus.

In November 2021, ground beams were completed along with plumbing work for the first floor bathrooms. In addition, two CCTV cameras were installed at the site to allow for daily monitoring of the construction progress. In December 2021, concrete was poured covering the first floor foundation and the first floor columns were erected. At the same time, excavation for the swimming pool began and sheet piles were installed. In January 2022, the second floor scaffolding was completed and the swimming pool subcontractor began to work on the pool system.

As we near the end of the academic year, we can now begin to see the structure of the three-story building taking its shape. The scaffolding for the third floor is complete, concrete for the main staircase has been poured, and the swimming pool structure has been formed. Work has now begun for the installation of bathroom fixtures and electrical wiring. The next six months will be a busy time at the site as the building will soon complete the structural phase of construction and move on to the exciting architectural phase.

Professional Development at MYIS

At MYIS, we value existing at the frontier of learning in this ever-changing and growing world of education. As new knowledge, concepts and approaches to teaching and learning emerge, it is our mission to stay informed and establish connections to our practice.

Thailand PYP Cluster Workshop

MYIS was proud to be the host of the first IB face-to-face workshops in Thailand since the start of the pandemic. Hosting 73 participants from 6 schools across Thailand in 3 different IB PYP workshops while maintaining strict COVID protocols was an incredible feat, filled with rich learning experiences for teachers and visible impacts on student learning across this week. Participants from across Thailand were inspired by our environments and teachers, commenting that our campus was their "Third Teacher"

MAP Assessment Training: Teachers analyzed and calibrated data and looked closely at the tools the MAP Assessment system provides for formative assessment.

Language Acquisition: Mr. Tan Hyunh spent a full day on campus in workshops with teachers and lab sites, co teaching with teachers in the classrooms.







Reading Engagement and Fluency: developing reading lives amongst our students and using our school library.

Early Years in the PYP: Ms. Meredith and Ms. Tahireh hosted a PYP Network workshop for 136 participants from IB schools across Southeast Asia, focused around new Early Years documents released from the IB, and shared with the network how MYIS is seamlessly integrating the PYP into our Early Years classrooms.

PYP South East Asia Network Job Alike: Throughout the year different departments have connected with their peers from PYP schools within the network and looked at latest practice and how to apply it in our own school. Sessions included: World

Language, Visual Arts, Action, Math, Early Years and Exhibition.

PYP Training for Co-Teachers: All MYIS co and specialist teachers participated in weekly IB training with other Thai speaking PYP teachers. This opportunity allowed them to gain a shared, in depth understanding of the programme. Teachers Teach Teachers: MYIS teachers run mini-workshops on topics, including Using Newsela in the Classroom; Thinking Routines; Self-Regulated Learners; Mindfulness; Outdoor Environments and Learner Agency.

Math Parent Workshop: Math workshop on the progression of fractions, led by our math consultant Caty Romero.




















PYP EXHIBITION


DISTANCE LEARNING
